The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The Speaker laid before the House reports from the clerks of Kent and Talbot counties;

Also, reports from the registers of wills for Queen Anne's, Prince George's and Baltimore counties, in obedience to the order of the House of Delegates of the 29th ult.;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, presented the petition of Solomon Hillen, and others, asking for leave to the Bedford Mineral Spring Rail Road Company, to extend their road so as to intersect the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company at Cumberland;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Graves presented the petition of Robert Fulton, of the city of Baltimore, asking power as guardian, to lease certain property in that city;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Graves also, presented the petition of Joseph Owens of Isaac, asking the return of money paid by him into the Treasury of the State, for escheat land;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on Claims.

Mr. Graves also, presented the petition of William Wilson and Sons, and some four hundred other citizens of Baltimore, praying that the present session may not be permitted to pass, without providing means for the payment of the creditors of the State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Polk presented the petition of Washington Dorney, and sundry other citizens of Harford county, praying for an alteration of the law in regard to the preservation of wild fowl in the waters of Bush and Gunpowder rivers;

Which was read and referred to the Harford county delegation.

Mr. Polk also presented the petition of Michael E. Pue, and sundry other citizens of Harford county, asking for the passage of a law, authorising the commissioners of said county, to levy a sum of money for the building of a bridge over Winter's run;

Which was read and referred to the Harford county delegation.

Mr. Shriver reported a bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Peter McGee, of Frederick county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Shriver presented the petition and testimony of Elizabeth Mosser, of Frederick county, asking for a pension;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.
