Ordered, That it be noted upon the Journal that if Messrs. Hellen and Hance, had been present when the vote was taken upon the bills from the Retrenchment committee, they would have voted in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Harris,

Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal that if he had been present when the vote was taken on the bill entitled, "an act to reduce the salaries of all officers paid out of the State Treasury," also, "an act to abolish the office of examiner general," and also, "an act providing for the competency of witnesses without regard to their peculiar religious opinions," he would have voted in the affirmative on each of these several propositions.

Leave was granted the committee on Colored Population, to bring in a bill to authorise Robert W. Latham and Lawrence P. Bayne of the city of Baltimore, to bring into this State four negro slaves for life.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Kent,

Leave was granted Messrs. Hollyday, of K., Harrison, Fletcher, Hollyday, of C., Graves, Stewart and Randall, to bring in a bill relating to the license laws.
