

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments,"
Which amendments were severally twice read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act relating to roads in Baltimore county;

Endorsed, "will not pass."

And delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Cuba Smelting and Mining Company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Ware from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to alter and amend the Constitution so as to give to Baltimore county, a clerk of Baltimore county court, a register of wills and an orphans' court, with one judge, separate and distinct from the city of Baltimore, to fix their salaries, and for other purposes;

Mr. Potter from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to prevent illegal voting in this State, and

Mr. Ware from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to alter and amend the Constitution, so as to reduce the term or service of the Senators of this State from six to three years;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Rogers from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road through a part of Carroll and Baltimore counties;

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the acts relating to the recording of deeds and bonds of conveyance in Baltimore county court;

Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid the acts of John W. Alder, as constable in Allegany county, for the years 1841 and 1842;

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act changing the time for the appointment of supervisors of the public roads in Cecil county, and authorising and empowering the president and clerk of the county commissioners of said county, to administer oaths and take affirmations in certain cases;

Mr. Thomson from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the more equal distribution of the State's donation to academies in Carroll county;

Mr. Long, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of Amelia Henrietta Fulton, and

Mr. Hellen from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise Robert W. Latham and Lawrence P. Bayne, of the city of Baltimore, to bring into this State, four negroes, slaves for life;
