

amount now due on account of the tobacco inspection in the city of Baltimore; and also, the amount in the Treasury applicable thereto, and whether any of the funds arising from said inspection have been applied to the general demands upon the Treasury," reports that the tobacco fund is responsible for the redemption of two loans, of \$30,000 each, and created by ch. 350 of 1835, and the other by ch. 310 of 1843.

The amount now standing to the credit of the fund is \$15,922 26.

The funds arising from the inspection of tobacco have not, so far as the Treasurer knows, been ever applied to the payment of the general demands upon the Treasury.
