

Which was read and referred to the Carroll county delegation.

Mr. Clarke presented the memorial of John Clay, of the city of Philadelphia, praying the passage of a law, extending to him the benefit of the insolvent laws of this State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Gallagher presented the memorial of James Hooper, and others, of the city of Baltimore, against the closing up of Eden lane, as prayed for in the petition of Margaret Parr;

Which was read and referred to the Baltimore city delegation.

Mr. Shriver presented the memorial of eighty-three citizens of Frederick county, praying for an act of incorporation, for the construction of a turnpike road from Frederick to Emmitsburg, in said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, presented the memorial of Edward Wilkins, and other citizens, of Quaker Neck, in Kent county, praying for the passage of an act to prohibit licenses being granted to any persons to sell ardent spirits within the limits of Quaker Neck;

Which was read and referred to the select committee appointed on that subject.

Mr. Harris presented the petition of Robert Brown, a free man of color, of Cecil county, and thirty white persons, praying the passage of a law to authorise him to bring into this State, his daughter Alice Brown, also a free black; and

Mr. Purnell presented the petition of James Law, of the State of Delaware, praying for an act to authorise him to remove into this State, certain negro slaves therein mentioned;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

On motion of Mr. Harrington,

Leave was granted the Talbot county delegation, to bring in a bill for the benefit of Elizabeth Hunt of Talbot county.

On motion of Mr. Clarke,

Leave was granted the Washington county delegation, to bring in a bill to authorise the clerk of Washington county court to prepare a general index of the judgments of said court, commencing with the year 1833, and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Clarke,

Leave was also granted the same delegation, to bring in a bill for the benefit of Jacob Boward, crier of Washington county court.

Also, to bring in a bill to allow Otho H. Williams, late clerk of Washington county, further time to place his fees in the hands of the sheriff of said county for collections.
