

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act of 1834, ch. 274, entitled, an act to extend the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore.

Also, to report a bill to incorporate the United Manufacturing Company of Maryland.

On motion of Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore city,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation, to bring in a bill in relation to the Baltimore United Fire Department.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Kent,

Leave was granted Messrs. Hollyday, of Kent, Long and Hollyday, of Cecil, to bring in a bill relating to executors and administrators.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Kent,

Leave was granted the delegation from Kent, to bring in a bill relating to the commissioners of Chestertown in Kent county,

On motion of Mr. Morsell,

Leave was granted the Calvert county delegation, to report a bill to make valid the official acts of James B. Harris, a justice of the peace in and for Calvert county.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Prince George's,

Ordered, That the committee on Claims, pay to Wm. J. Ross, the contestant of the seat of Caspar Quynn, the sitting Senator from Frederick county, the usual per diem for forty day's attendance at the seat of Government.

Mr. Archer submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the committee appointed by this House, to visit the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal on public business, be allowed the per diem usual in such cases;

Which was twice read and rejected.

Mr. Johnson, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act in aid of the Susquehanna Canal Company and of the Tide Water Canal Company, passed December session 1843, ch. 363, and

Mr. Lynch, from the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the United Manufacturing company of Maryland;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to justices of the peace, to constables, and to judicial process;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Muse from the select committee reported a bill entitled, an act authorising the sale of certain real estate belonging to the heirs of Daniel James, late of Dorchester county, deceased;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.
