Also, the bill entitled, an act explanatory to an act passed at December session 1834, relative to the school funds of Caroline county ;

Also, the bill entitled, an act authorising and empowering the commissioners of Cecil county, to levy a sum of money for building a bridge over Basin run, in said county ;

Also, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for specie payments by the banks ;

Also, the bill entitled, an act making additional provision for the crier of Anne Arundel county court ;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, a supplement to the acts relating to the recording of deeds and bonds of conveyance in Baltimore county court ;

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Benjamin S. Ireland, adm'r. of Richard E. Ireland, late sheriff and collector of Calvert county ;

Severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments,"
