sis, and that the entire public domain yet unsold, computed to be 1,042,731,765 acres ought to be pledged specifically for the pay-

ment of the same.

Resolved further, That our Senators and Representatives in Congress, are hereby earnestly requested to advocate such a measure, and to do all in their power to secure its adoption at the earliest period practicable.
