MONDAY, January 6th, 1845.

The House met. Present the same members as on Saturday.

The proceedings of Saturday were read.

John T. H. Worthington, Esquire, a delegate returned from Baltimore county, appeared, qualified, and took his seat.

The bill entitled, an act to extend the time of William Dellinger, late collector of Washington county;

Also, the resolution requiring the Treasurer of the State to pay over the balance of money due the late Henry Hobbs, as Examiner General, to his mother Mrs. Amelia Pinkney; and

The message proposing the appointment of a joint committee of the two Houses, to wait on his Excellency the Governor elect, and request his attendance this day in the Senate Chamber to qualify according to the Constitution and Form of Government;

Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to alter and change the name of William Flood Brand to William Francis Brand;

Was returned to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation, to bring in a bill relating to the practice in Baltimore county court, in certain cases.

On motion of Mr. Fooks,

Leave was granted the Worcester county delegation to bring in a bill entitled, an act concerning the draining of swamps and low grounds, and the laying out and opening public ditches in this State.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany,

Leave was granted the Allegany county delegation, to bring in a bill in relation to the repair of that portion of the National road within the limits of Maryland.
