

Resolved, That our Senators and Representatives, be respectfully requested to urge the subject of the foregoing resolutions upon the attention of Congress, and procure their early action thereon.

Which were read the first and by a special order the second time, and assented to.

Mr. Potter chairman of the committee on Elections, submitted the following order :

Ordered, That a subpoena duces tecum, be issued by the clerk of this House, directed to the sergeant-at-arms, commanding him to summon forthwith Henry R. Smeltzer and Ignatius Jacobs, of Frederick county, and directing said persons to appear before the committee on Elections, with the ballots referred to in the memorial of Edward Buckey ;

Which was twice read and adopted.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel,

Ordered, That the Treasurer report to this House, the amount which has been paid into the Treasury, by the banks and other incorporated institutions in the State, and the register of the city of Baltimore, under the act of December session 1843, chapter 289, specifying the amount paid by each, and whether any, and if any, which of the said banks, or other incorporated institutions, have neglected or refused to comply with the provisions of the said act; and if he is informed, their reason for such neglect or refusal; and the reason of the neglect or refusal, of the register of the city of Baltimore, if he has disregarded the provisions of said act.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Leave was granted Messrs. Graves, Gallagher and Williams, of Baltimore city, to bring in a bill to allow W. H. Redwood, of the city of Baltimore, to bring his negro slave Emily into this State.

Mr. Poole submitted the following resolutions :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby authorised to liquidate and pay the postage accounts of the several members of the two Houses now in session and of their successors hereafter, on all communications and documents received by them, while in the discharge of their public duties at the seat of Government, and upon all letters and newspapers; and the journals and public documents, published by order of either House, forwarded by them and their successors hereafter; provided, the name of the member forwarding the same, and the character of the enclosed documents be endorsed thereon.

Resolved, That all resolutions or orders inconsistent with the above resolution shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.
