Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Divorces.

The Speaker laid before the House a report from the inspector of hides and skins in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Inspections.

Mr. Amos presented the petition of Baker Rigdon, of Harford county, praying to be placed on the pension roll of said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Amos, Yellott and Archer.

Mr. Spencer presented the memorial of Howard Meeks, of Kent county, relative to primary schools;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

On motion of Mr. Biser,

Leave was granted the Frederick county delegation, to bring in a bill supplementary to an act entitled, an act to revive the twelfth, thirteenth, fourteenth and fifteenth sections of an act passed at December session 1815, chapter 166, entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the Frederick and Baltimore turnpike road, commencing at the west end of Frederick town to Harpers' Ferry on the Potomac river, passed at December session 1838, chapter 268.

On motion of Mr. Shriver,

Leave was granted the Frederick county delegation, to bring in a bill explanatory of the act passed at November session 1796.

On motion of Mr. Ford,

Leave was granted Messrs. Ford, of St. Mary's, Thomas and Hopewell, to bring in a bill to incorporate the trustees of the primary schools in St. Mary's county.

On motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill entitled, an act regulating the sessions of the Court of Appeals for the Western Shore, and providing for the trial of causes therein.

On motion of Mr. Ware,

Ordered, That the committee on Ways and Means, be instructed to inquire why the delinquent canal and rail road, and other incorporations, in which the State has an interest, have not paid into the State Treasury, respectively, their surplus receipts and revenue, so far as they are indebted and in arrear to the State,
