

what means can be devised to compel the punctual payment hereafter to the State of the accruing revenue and surplus of said corporations, so far as they may become indebted to the State, under existing laws; and, that they be permitted to report by bill or otherwise.

On motion of Mr. Purnell,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill to make valid a deed from William M. Henderson, of the city of Baltimore, to Edward Lambden of Worcester county.

Mr. Ware submitted the following order:

Ordered. That his Excellency the Governor, be requested to cause the flag of our country, to be displayed at the top of the State House steeple, on Wednesday the 8th instant, and cause a national salute to be fired at 12 o'clock, noon, of said day, in commemoration of the glorious victory achieved at New Orleans on the 8th January, 1815;

Which was twice read and adopted.

The Speaker laid before the House, the annual report of the Treasurer of the State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The clerk of the Senate returned the resolution in favor of the members and officers of the Legislature;

Also, the resolution providing for the repairs of the Government House;

Severally endorsed, assented to, and ordered to be engrossed.

Also, returned the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to introduce wholesome water into the city of Frederick, endorsed, "will pass," and ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to the practice in Baltimore county court in certain cases;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That the Treasurer be requested to report to this House, the amount of receipts in the Treasury from the 1st December 1844, to the present date.

Mr. Hopewell submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State, be, and he is hereby authorised to pay to Henry Fowler, for the use of Clement Thompson, the legal representative of Milley Powers, the balance due her at the time of her death, on the pension list of the State;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.
