Mr. Worthington, of Baltimore county, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Hereford circuit, in Baltimore county;

Also, a bill entitled, an act to correct an error and make valid a deed from Daniel Bosley to Thomas Bosley, and also, a deed from Thomas Bosley to Charles Jessop and others;

Mr. Kilgour from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Samuel T. Stonestreet, trustee of Brice Selby, late clerk of Montgomery county;

Mr. Biser from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to revive the twelfth, thirteenth, fourteenth and fifteenth sections of an act passed at December session 1815, chapter 166, entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road, commencing at the west end of Fredericktown to Harper's Ferry on the Potomac river, passed at December session 1838, chapter 268;

Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the Senate.
