On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The House was called and the doorkeeper sent for the absent members.

On motion of Mr. Morsell,

The House resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the doorkeeper.

Mr. Hellen submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby required and directed to invest one thousand dollars, out of any monies in the Treasury belonging to the common school fund of Calvert county, in stocks of the Farmers' Bank of Maryland;

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Morsell,

The House agreed to give said resolution a second reading by special order.

The doorkeeper having returned, reported, that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the House was required.

The House then resumed the consideration of the unfavorable report submitted by Mr. Calvert upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to repeal in part the third section of an act entitled, an act for the re-valuation of the assessable property in Prince George's county, passed at December session 1824, chapter 38, and for other purposes, and the substitute offered therefor by Mr. Bowie, being a bill entitled, an act to repeal all such laws or parts of laws as direct the appointment of the clerk to the levy court of Prince George's county, during good behaviour or for life;
