So the message was assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Ghiselin from the select committee, reported a bill entitled an act to authorise Thos. M. D. Baden, former collector of Prince George's county, further time to complete his collections ;

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Randall from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to establish religious freedom ;

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

The hour of eleven o'clock having arrived, the House proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. Kilgour, entitled, an act to alter and amend the Constitution and form of Government, so as to substitute biennial for annual sessions of the Legislature, and for other purposes ;

The said bill having been read through,

Mr. Gallagher moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill ;

Determined in the negative.

The bill was then placed in the hands of the Chair.

Mr. Freeman moved to withdraw said bill from the hands of the Chair for the purpose of amendment ;

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Freeman then moved to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof the following as an additional section :

"And whereas, it is to be desired that the next legislature may know whether so important an alteration in the Constitution and Form of Government of this State, as is contemplated by this act is in accordance with the will of the people—therefore,

"Be it enacted, That at the next annual election for delegates to the General Assembly of Maryland, the judges of the election of the several cities and counties of this State, shall enquire of each voter as he may come to cast his ballot, whether he is for or against the provisions of this bill, and shall record his vote accord-
