Mr. Hammill moved to amend said order by striking out "five hundred," and inserting in lieu thereof, "eighty-two;"

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put, on the adoption of said order; and

Determined in the affirmative.

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill entitled, an act declaratory of the law of contempts of court.

The Speaker laid before the House a report from the clerk of Carroll county court, relative to the attendance of judges;
