

Justice, be instructed to inquire into the expediency of reporting a bill to make illegal voting a Penitentiary offence.

On motion of Mr. Ware,

Ordered, That the committee on Colored Population, be instructed to inquire into the expediency of further regulating negro camp-meetings; and that they be authorised to report by bill or otherwise.

Mr. Graves reported a bill entitled, an act to change the name of Jerome Boss, to that of Jerome Boss White, and

Mr. Morsell reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Zachariah Sunderland, of Calvert county;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, severally passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Graves reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise W. H. Redwood, of Baltimore, to hold and retain in this State negro girl Emily;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time;

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

Said bill was referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Shriver reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act relating to the manumission of negro slaves;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day;

The House resumed the consideration of the preamble and resolutions, submitted by Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, on the 4th instant, in relation to the issue of two hundred millions of government stock, for the relief of the States.

After debate thereon,

The said preamble and resolutions were read the second time, and the question put,

“Will the House assent to the preamble and resolutions?”

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Worthington, of Baltimore county,
