Said bill was amended by striking out the 4th section thereof.

Mr. Ghiselin moved further to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof as an additional section the following :

"Sec. 4. Be it enacted, That the operations of this act shall be confined to the Eastern Shore of this State ;"

Which was read.

Mr. Goldsborough moved to lay said bill and amendments on the table ;
