

On motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to provide for lessening the expenses of Baltimore city court.

On motion of Mr. Purnell, Leave was granted the Worcester county delegation, to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to divide the second and third election districts in Worcester county into three election districts.

Mr. Randall submitted the following resolution : Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of Baltimore county pay to the order of the trustees of Green Lane academy, in the second election district of said county, one hundred dollars to be applied by the said trustees to the education of poor children, in the manner as now applied by the primary schools ; the sum aforesaid to be paid out of the moneys due the said district for primary schools ;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following resolution :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of this State be, and he is hereby authorised and required to re-deliver to the Franklin Bank of Baltimore the receipt of the Commissioner of Loans for coupons and certificates of interest for three hundred and twenty-three dollars and seventy-eight cents, dated the 27th of November, 1844, paid by the said bank into the Treasury for taxes due upon the capital stock of the said bank for the year 1844 ; the said tax having been adjudged by the Supreme Court of the United States unconstitutionally levied for the said year ;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Kilgour, chairman of the committee on Claims, made an unfavorable report upon the account of Thomas H. Hooper against the State ;

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, submitted the following order : Ordered, That at 11 o'clock this day, the House will proceed to take up the following special orders of the day, viz :

1st. The bill entitled, an act to provide for the payment, first of the principal and afterwards of the interest of the public debt.

2nd. The bill entitled, an act to limit the tenure of office of judges and of the chancellor hereafter to be appointed.

3rd. The bill entitled, an act to lessen the number of judges in certain judicial districts.
