sued by authority of the act of December session eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, chapter three hundred and eighty-six; or whether they have ever been, or are now hypothecated, and for what purpose? If not, whether said bonds are now in the actual possession of said company, to be by them delivered up to the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to be cancelled, if it should be the will of the present General Assembly;

Which was twice read and adopted.

Mr. Archer presented the petition of Clement Butler, collector of tax in Harford county, praying to be allowed his commissions; Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

On motion of Mr. Keene,

Ordered, That it be entered on the journal, that if Messrs. Keene, Muse and Tall, had been present when the votes were taken on Mr. Johnson's resolutions on the issue of two hundred millions of government stock, for the relief of the States, they would have voted in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil,

Leave was granted the Čecil county delegation, to bring in a bill making valid deeds and other instruments of writing made and executed by William Butler Callicot and Margaret Callicot his wife, of Cecil county, aliens by birth previous to their naturalization.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill confirming an act passed at the last session, entitled, an act to amend the Constitution and Form of Government of this State, prohibiting any monies being drawn from the Treasury of this State, but in consequence of appropriations made by law.

On motion of Mr. Ware,

Leave was granted the Baltimore county delegation, to bring in a bill to increase the jurisdiction of justices of the peace of Baltimore county, and prescribe the duties of constables thereof.

Mr. Gallagher submitted the following order:

Ordered, That when this House adjourn on to-morrow, it stand adjourned until Monday at 12 o'clock.
