Also, the bill entitled, an act to make a public road therein mentioned;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to enable aliens to hold real property in this State;

Severally endorsed "will not pass."

Also, the resolution requiring the orphans' court of Calvert county to invest the school fund of said county;

Also, the resolution relative to a bill reported to the 27th Congress, to found a Military Asylum for the relief and support of invalid soldiers of the United States;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and the resolutions ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered the following bills originated in and passed by the Senate, viz:

A bill entitled, an act relating to the judgments and judicial proceedings of the courts of justice in this State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Cumberland, Baltimore and New York Steam Packet company; and

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate a Mutual Fire Insurance company in the several counties of Cecil, Kent, Queen Anne's and Talbot;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Also, returned the bill entitled, an act to allow Joseph Pearson, late collector of Caroline county, further time to complete his collections;

Endorsed, "will pass," and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the relief of the Farmers' and Millers' Bank of Hagerstown;

Endorsed "will pass, with the proposed amendment;"

Which amendment was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act declaratory of the law concerning contempts of court;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to regulate the compensation of certain officers;

Severally endorsed, "will not pass,"

Also, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Farmers' and Mechanics' Band of Middletown valley;

Endorsed "reconsidered and will pass," and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolution in favor of James H. Coulter;
