

Mr. Bowie moved to amend said substitute by inserting after the word "shall," the words "this night ;"

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put, "

"Will the House accept the substitute?"

Resolved in the affirmative.

The question then recurred upon the adoption of the order ;

Mr. Gallagher moved to lay the order on the table ;

Determined in the negative.

The question again recurred and was put, on the adoption of the order ; and

Determined in the affirmative.

The House then resumed the consideration of the bill entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, to Cumberland, and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Frazier,

Said bill was amended by striking out from the words "transportation," in the 3rd section, 12th line to the word "tons," in the 13th line, and inserting in lieu thereof the following : "on the entire length between Cumberland and the District of Columbia, on said Canal, of not less than one hundred and ninety-five thousand."

Mr. Archer moved further to amend said bill by striking out in the 5th section, 9th line, from the word "any," to the word "company," inclusive in the 13th line ;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Calvert moved to amend said bill by inserting as the 6th section thereof the following :

"Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That the right is hereby reserved to the State of Maryland, of requiring the said canal company to extend a branch of said canal or other improved navigation from the town of Cumberland to the coal banks at or near the mouth of Savage river, whenever hereafter it shall appear to the Legislature that the public interest will be advanced by such extension, and of providing for the expenses of making said extension out of the profits of said work, and out of one-half part of the tolls which may be received by the canal company for the use of the main canal in the transportation from Cumberland, eastwardly of articles which may be supplied from the said extension to the main canal at Cumberland ;"

Determined in the negative.
