"Which mortgage shall be submitted to the Attorney General of this State, and be approved by him as sufficient in law;"

"Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That the said canal company, shall charge in addition to the usual toll the sum of twelve cents per ton on all coal and iron, which may be transported on said Canal, and shall at the end of each and every quarter, pay into the treasury, the amount so received, and at the same time deposit with the Treasurer a statement of the amount of each of said articles so transported;"
