Resolved, as the sense of this House that no clerk of a court or register of wills of the State of Maryland, should receive for his services (over and above his expenses,) more than the sum of fifteen hundred dollars a year.

Resolved, That all excesses over that sum shall be paid into the Treasury, under sworn statements, to be applied in aid of the payment of the direct tax as the Legislature may direct.

Resolved, That the number of assistant clerks necessary in those offices, and their compensations, and necessary contingent expenses should be settled from year to year by a committee of the Legislature, or some other tribunal to be designated by law;
