Determined in the negative.

Mr. Goldsborough moved to strike out the third section of the bill;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Rogers called for the previous question, which being demanded by a majority of the members present, the said previous question was put, that is, "Shall the main question be now put?" and it was

Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put,

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative;

And the bill sent to the Senate.

The House took up for consideration, the bill reported by Mr. Hollyday of Cecil, entitled, an act relating to sales of property by constables;

Which was read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

The House took up for consideration the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the protection of firemen and of the property of fire companies in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That His Excellency the Governor, be authorised to settle with the printers of this House for such reports, &c., as have been ordered to be printed by the House and not yet received, and that the chief clerk be directed to forward the same by mail, together with the balance of the journal of proceedings, to the members of the Legislature, the postage of the same to be paid by the Treasurer of the State;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Kilgour moved to take up the bill No. 88, on the printed file;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, seconded by two other members that voted in the affirmative, moved to reconsider the vote of the House upon the bill entitled, an act to limit the tenure of office of the Attorney General;

Resolved in the affirmative.
