Speaker, five dollars each on presentation of a certificate from the clerk of the House, certifying to their respective attendance;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Gallagher submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor be and he is hereby authorised to apply the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, if in his judgment necessary, to the purchase of furniture for the chamber of the court of appeals for the western shore;

Mr. Kilgour moved to strike out the words "and fifty;"

Determined in the affirmative.

The said resolution as amended, was read the second time by special order, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before the House the following letter:

House of Delegates, March 10th, 1845.

Dear Sir:—I herewith resign my seat as a member of the House of Delegates.

Determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred and was put,

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative.
