Which were read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, submitted the following resolution: Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised to allow and pay to Messrs. Blackistone and Sellman, committee of the Senate, to take testimony in the contested election of Messrs. Quynn and Ross, the usual compensation in such cases—and the usual allowance for the clerk of said committee and witnesses who may be summoned by said committee:

Which was read the first and by a special order the scond time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Clarke submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General of this State be, and he is hereby authorised to furnish Capt. Peter L. Hayett, of the Mcrgan Riflemen, and Capt. James N. Magruder, of the Potomac Riflemen, with fifty knapsacks, each, by giving satisfactory security for their safe keeping and return;

Which was read.

Mr. Kilgour moved to amend said resolution by adding at the end thereof, "provided, they are in the Armory;"

Determined in the affirmative.

And the resolution as amended, was read the second time assented to, and sent to the Senate.

The committee appointed to wait upon His Excellency the Governor, and request his attendance in the Senate chamber to sign and seal the laws, reported that they had discharged that duty and that the Governor would attend at the hour appointed.

Mr. Shriver reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal the law passed at December session 1841, chapter 215, so far as that act repeals the law passed at December session 1837, chapter 327;

Which was referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly.

The House took up for consideration the bill from the Senate, entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States road within the limits of Maryland, and the amendments proposed thereto;

Said amendments were read and rejected.

The said bill was then passed, and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Hammill reported a bill entitled, an act for the division of Allegany county;

Which vas read and ordered to lie on the table.
