So the order was adopted.

Mr. Ware reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal the second section of an act passed at December session 1838, ch. 263, and

Mr. Shriver reported a bill, a supplementary act to an act entitled, an act relating to the City Hotel of Frederick ;

Which were severally read the first and by special order the second time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Worthington, of Baltimore County,

Ordered, That the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice enquire into the expediency of directing the foreclosure of the several mortgages or other liens held by the State of Maryland against the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, and if expedient and advisable that said committee report a bill or resolution directing the Attorney General of the State to institute suit or suits against said company forthwith.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore City, submitted the following preamble and order :

Whereas, A number of communications are forwarded to the assistant clerk on public business, and whereas it has been the custom of the Legislature to pay the postage of the chief and assistant clerks of the two houses, Therefore,

Ordered that the committee on Claims pay the postage account of the assistant clerk to this House.

Which was twice read and adopted.

On motion of Mr. Williams, of Somerset,

The House adjourned until Monday morning 12 o'clock.

MONDAY, January 13th, 1845.

The House met. Present the same members as on Friday. The proceedings of Friday were read.
