Gentlemen, I have one source of regret attending my association with you during the present session. It is, that the duties which I have had to discharge, and the many demands upon my time arising from my position as a Delegate and from claims which an acquaintance in the State, not very limited have necessarily made upon me, have prohibited a more general social intercourse with you. We are now to separate, never in any probability all to meet again on earth. At this, our parting, permit me to hope that our lives and conduct may be governed by such influences that we may be permitted to re-assemble in that Great Hall where human wants and human imperfections will have ceased to require human legislation—under that Great Lawgiver, whose statute book contains but one law and that of perfect, universal and enduring love.
