Barings of London, their agent in this country, and the commissioner of loans, in reference to the claims of the Messrs. Barings against the State of Maryland, for advances made by them, and that he also furnish the House with a copy of the account or accounts of the said Messrs. Barings against the State of Maryland, on account of the same, and also state the several amounts paid the Messrs. Barings on account of their advances.

Mr. Patterson submitted the following preamble and resolution:

Whereas, the Constitution of the United States, guarantees to each State of this Union, the exclusive right to regulate its internal policy, and to pass such laws as each may deem necessary to protect the rights and property of its citizens; therefore,

Resolved, That as the sense of the Legislature of this State, the late attempt of the State of Massachusetts, in sending an emissary into the State of South Carolina, to contest a law of that State, against the entrance of free negroes into its limits, is an unjustifiable interference with the domestic concerns of that State, and an evidence of an unfriendly feeling towards the institutions of the southern portion of this confederacy;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and
