

CONSTITUTION—

76; bill reported 184; taken up 221; amendment proposed 222; laid on the table 227.

Bill reported to alter and amend the, 87; taken up, amended and passed 137; motion to reconsider passed and the bill laid on the table 138.

Order adopted requiring the committee on grievances and courts of justice to enquire into the expediency of reporting a bill to amend the, so as to limit the tenure of judges and the chancellor to seven years, and of the attorney general to three years, and to limit the number of judges in the first, second, third, fourth and fifth judicial districts to two 113; unfavorable report thereon 218.

Bill to alter the, so as to limit the tenure of office of judges and of the chancellor, submitted as a substitute for the unfavorable report and made the order of the day 220; taken up and the substitute rejected 475.

Bill to alter the, so as to lessen the number of judges in certain judicial districts, reported as a substitute for the report, and made the order of the day 220; taken up 475; the substitute amended 476; considered 485; motion to refer to the next General Assembly negatively 485; the bill further amended 486; laid on the table *ib.*

A bill to alter the, so as to limit the tenure of office of the attorney general, submitted as a substitute for the report and made the order of the day 220; taken up and the substitute rejected 474; vote reconsidered 481; amendment proposed and rejected 483; amended, passed and sent to the senate 484; returned rejected 507.

Leave granted to report a bill to amend the, so as to reduce the tenure of State senators from six to three years 121; bill reported 249; motion to strike out the enacting clause determined in the affirmative 392.

Leave granted to report a bill to amend the, so as to provide for the election of clerks and registers by the people 125; bill reported 279.

Order adopted that the committee who reported the above, enquire into the propriety of so amending the, as to make all clerks and registers of wills ineligible after a first term of service 191.

Order submitted that the committee on grievances and courts of justice enquire into the expediency of altering the so as to reduce the six judicial districts into four, to limit the number of judges to one, with limited term of service, and to fix their salaries, adopted 140.
