On motion of Mr. Hughes,

Leave was granted the Charles county delegation, to bring in a bill relating to primary schools in Charles county.

On motion of Mr. Fitzpatrick,

The House was called and the doorkeeper sent for the absent members.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation, to bring in a bill to fix the day on which the Mayor of the city of Baltimore, shall hereafter take his seat.

The doorkeeper having returned reported, that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the House was required.
