On motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the members of the Baltimore Club.

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough,

Ordered, That it be entered on the journal, that if Messrs Goldsborough and Harrington, had been present when the vote was taken on Mr. Johnson's resolutions, for the issue of two hundred millions of government stock for the relief of the States, they would have voted in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore report to this House at as early a day as may be practicable the amount of the salaries paid annually to each salaried officer in the State, and to whom, and the amount paid for per diem services or as fees out of the Treasury and to whom.

On motion of Mr. Archer,

Ordered, That the committee on Inspections be directed to inquire into the expediency of providing for the appointment of two wood corders in the town of Havre de Grace, and report thereon to the House.
