

**INSOLVENT LAWS**—Petition of Jeremiah Low and others, praying an alteration in the, in relation to seducers, referred 217.

Petition of John Clay of Philadelphia praying to have the benefit of the, of this State, extended to him, referred 253; bill reported 265; passed and sent to the senate 317; returned rejected 394.

**INSPECTION**—Leave granted to report a bill to amend section 8, of chapter 181 of 1827, regulating the guaging of casks and the, of domestic distilled liquors 32.

Bill reported repealing certain acts relative to the, of green hides and skins in Baltimore 50; taken up and referred 66; unfavorable report and bill rejected 140.

The committee on, directed to enquire into the expediency of establishing an, of wheat and corn in Baltimore 57; bill reported and ordered to lie on the table 259.

The committee on, directed to enquire into the expediency of providing for the appointment of two additional inspectors of leather in Baltimore 57; petition of certain dealers in leather in Baltimore, praying that the number of inspectors may not be increased 99.

Bill from the senate supplemental to the act for the, of sole leather, rough harness and rough skirting leather, in Baltimore, referred 245; unfavorable report, the bill rejected and returned to the senate 381; message accompanying the bill requesting a reconsideration, referred 408; bill passed 502; reconsidered, amended, passed and returned to the senate 503.

Petition of citizens of this State, praying a reduction in the expense of the, of plaster, referred 61.

Leave granted to report a bill supplementary to the act providing for the, of plaster of paris 76; bill reported, passed and sent to the senate 157; returned rejected 507.

Petition of citizens of Baltimore for a law to provide for the, of white oak staves and heading referred 84.

The committee on ways and means directed to enquire into the expediency of increasing the rates of, and license, as an additional source of revenue to the State 100.

The committee on, directed to enquire into the expediency of requiring the inspector of plaster in Baltimore, to be a practical chemist 123.
