

On motion of Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel,
Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, to repeal certain acts relative to the inspection of green hides and skins in the city of Baltimore was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Thomas,
Said bill was referred to the committee on Inspections.

The bill reported by Mr. Gallagher, chairman of the committee on Corporations, entitled, an act to continue the charter of the Fell's Point Savings' Institution of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,
Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Purnell, entitled, an act to repeal a part of the second section of an act passed at December session 1831, chapter 323, was taken up for consideration;

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, moved to lay said bill on the table,

Determined in the negative.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, entitled, an act relating to the practice of the Court of Appeals in certain cases, was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil,
Said bill was amended by striking out the first section thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That cases on the trial docket of the Court of Appeals, and on the trial docket of the County Courts in the second judicial district shall be continued by consent on the application of the respective parties or of their counsel;"

The said bill was then read the second time as amended and passed.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil,
The title of said bill was amended by inserting after the word "appeals," the words "and of the second judicial district ;"

The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Graves,
It was ordered, That all bills reported from the Committee on Ways and Means, and entitled to a second reading, be made the order of the day for Tuesday next.

Mr. Poole reported a bill entitled, an act to reduce the per diem of the judges and clerks of Election in Frederick county ;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time.

On motion of Mr. Raymond,
Said bill was amended by striking out in the 1st section, third line the word "county," and inserting in lieu thereof the words, "and Carroll counties."
