

Mr. Lamden from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to change the name of Alice Fowler White, the infant daughter of Edward H. White, of Worcester county, to Alice Priscilla White;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Shriver entitled, a further supplement to an act relating to the manumission of negro slaves;

Was taken up for consideration, and

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, presented the petition of Mary McDowell, praying to be placed on the pension roll of Maryland;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.

Mr. Thomas presented the petition of sundry citizens of Saint Mary's county, praying an alteration in the road law of said county;

Which was read and referred to the Saint Mary's county delegation.

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following preamble and resolution:

Whereas, at the last session of the General Assembly, a preamble and resolution was passed, respectfully requesting the President of the United States, to reinstate Commander W. J. Belt, to the station he held in the American Navy, prior to the sentence of a court martial in the year 1842; and whereas, the said resolution did not request that a copy of the said preamble and resolution should be forwarded to the President by the Governor—therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That His Excellency the Governor, be requested to transmit to the President of the United States, a copy of the said preamble and resolution, and to ask his favorable consideration thereof;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Shriver presented the petition of William Motter, praying the passage of a certain law therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Hughes presented the petition of Elizabeth Ellen Wildman, to allow Thomas B. Gwinn, her trustee, to bring back to this State, her servant Rachel;

Which was read and referred to the Charles county delegation.
