Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to allow Norman Bruce, late collector of taxes in Allegany county, further time to complete his collections, and

Mr. Amos reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Baker Rigdon, jr. of Harford county;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, an act to cure defective deeds from Thomas Bittle and Mary Bittle, and others, to Daniel Brown and John Summers, of Frederick county;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to authorise W. W. Redwood, of Baltimore, to hold and retain in this State, negro girl Emily;

Also, the bill entitled, a supplementary act to an act entitled, an act relating to the City Hotel of Frederick;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and severally ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate entitled, an act to change the name of William Marshall to William Leonard;

Which was read and referred to the Talbot county delegation.

Also, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Ashland Manufacturing Company of Maryland;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.
