Leave was granted the committee on Colored Population, to bring in a bill, authorising James T. Pritchett, to bring into this State from the State of Virginia, a slave negro girl called Margaret, aged eight years.

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill, entitled, an act relating to non-resident
