Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Harrison from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to change the name of John Louis Cass to John Louis

Which was read the first and by a special order the second titled, an act to reduce the per them of the judges

On motion of Mr. Calvert,

Said bill was amended by inserting the words "Cass," after the word "Lewis;"

The said bill was then passed as amended.

On motion of Mr. Calvert,

The title of said bill was amended by inserting after the word "Lewis," the word "Cass:"

The bill was then sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, made an unfavorable report upon the order of the House, requiring said committee, to inquire into the expediency of appropriating for a limited term, a part or the whole of the donations allowed to the several academies and colleges of this State, to the payment of the interest of the public debt;

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, submitted the following order: Ordered, That the committee of Ways and Means, inquire into the expediency of appropriating the interest on the surplus revenue, received from the United States, and heretofore appropriated for free schools, either to the annual increase of the sinking fund, or to the payment of interest on the public debt.
