

MONDAY, January 20th, 1845.

The House met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The Speaker laid before the House, a report from Thomas Kell, Esq. clerk of Baltimore county court, in obedience to the order of the House of Delegates of the 4th inst. ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The Speaker also, laid before the House, a report from John Tilghman, clerk of Queen Anne's county court, in obedience to the order of the House of Delegates of the 8th inst. ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Ford, of Queen Anne's, presented the report of the commissioners of the school fund for Queen Anne's county ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Randall presented the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying the passage of a law to prevent the sale of spirituous liquors ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Rogers presented the memorial of Ann W. Brown, of Carroll county, praying the passage of an act authorising the sale of certain land therein mentioned, and the proceeds to be invested for the benefit of her children ;

Which was read and referred to the Carroll county delegation.

Mr. Worthington, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following message :

*By the House of Delegates,*

*January 20th, 1845.*

*Gentlemen of the Senate.*

We hereby request your honorable body to return the bill which passed this House on the 17th inst. entitled, an act to reduce the per diem of the judges of elections in Frederick, Carroll and Anne Arundel counties.

Which was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

Ordered, That the petitions of Ann C. Foreman and Mary Allen, of the city of Baltimore, presented at the last session of the legislature, severally praying to be placed on the pension roll of Maryland, in consideration of the services rendered by their husbands in the War of the Revolution, be withdrawn from the files of the House, and the same referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.
