Ordered, That the petition of Anthony Smith and Richard Gambrill, of Howard District, praying additional compensation for their services as assessors under the act of 1840, be withdrawn from the files of this House.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Leave was granted Messrs. Graves, Stansbury, of Baltimore city, Williams, of Balt. city, Springer and Gallagher, to bring in a bill to re-organise the city court of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Randall,

Leave was granted Messrs. Randall, Walker, Stansbury, of Baltimore county, Worthington, of Baltimore county, and Ware, to bring in a bill entitled, an act relating to roads in Baltimore county.

On motion of Mr. Clarke.
