SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET NO. 2—FISCAL YEAR 1970

AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 181 AND/OR
HOUSE BILL NO. 348

Amendment No. 1

On page 8 of the printed bill, under the heading "Executive Department-Management Audit" and under the program "Examination and Auditing", insert the following footnote:

"That it is the intention these funds shall be transferred by approved budget amendment to the budget of the Department of Budget and Procurement."

Amendment No. 2

In the mimeographed supplemental budget on page 17 under the heading "State Department of Social Services" and under the program "Supplementation of Rental Allowance" strike out the "Program Code 11.01.01.13" and insert in its place the "Program Code 11.01.01.14."

Amendment No. 3

On page 44 of the printed bill, under the heading "Medical Care Services" and under the program "Medical Assistance Program," insert the following footnote:

"Payments hereunder are authorized not to exceed \$13.50 per day per patient, for nursing home care in extended care facilities and licensed nursing homes, provided these homes qualify as skilled nursing homes under the regulations promulgated by the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare under Title XIX of Public Law 89-97 (Medicaid), such nursing homes and extended care facilities shall be reimbursed on the following basis: (A) verified audited 'cost' as that term is determined by the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare in the administration of Title XVIII of the Social Security Act amendments of 1965; plus (B) any additional audited business expenses not specifically allowed by the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare, which are determined by the Board of Public Works to be actual and necessary costs of providing skilled nursing care, as the term skilled nursing care is defined by the Health Department. Actual and necessary costs shall include an equitable profit factor which shall be determined by the Board of Public Works. Homes not submitting audited costs and homes not qualified to participate under Title XIX of Public Law 89-97 shall be reimbursed at a rate not to exceed \$7.00 per day per patient."
