- any of the provisions of this section, the public school employer shall render the final determination as to all matters which have been the subject of negotiation, but this final determination shall still be subject to other provisions of this Article concerning the fiscal relationship between the public school employer and the county commissioners, county council, or the Mayor and Council of Baltimore City.
- (1) Employee organizations shall be prohibited from calling or directing a strike. If an employee organization designated as exclusive representative shall violate the provisions hereof, its designation as exclusive representative shall be revoked by the public school employer, and said employee organization and any other employee organization which violates any of the provisions hereof, shall be ineligible to be designated as exclusive representative for a period of two (2) years thereafter. If any employee organization violates the provisions hereof, the public school employer shall refrain from making payroll deductions for that organization's dues for a period of one (1) year thereafter.
- (m) The enactment of this section shall not be construed so as to make the provisions of the Maryland Labor Laws contained in Articles 89 and 100 of this Code applicable to public school employment.
- (n) If any provision of this section or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the section which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application; and to this end the provisions of this section are severable.

## 161. Chapter 15. Public Broadcasting

Maryland Public Broadcasting Commission.

- (a) Created; purpose; budget; personnel.—The Maryland Public Broadcasting Commission is created to develop, operate, and maintain a system of State, regional and local facilities to provide educational and cultural television and radio programming in the State. The Commission shall anually prepare a budget request to provide funds required to properly perform these functions and shall employ such personel PERSONNEL as may be required to fulfill the responsibilities of the Commission and to coordinate all functions of the television and radio systems.
- (b) Appointment of members; chairman and vice chairman; terms of members; vacancies; qualifications; compensation and expenses.—(1) The Maryland Public Broadcasting Commission shall consist of eleven (11) members to be apointed APPOINTED by the Governor. From time to time the Governor shall designate one person to be chairman and another to be vice chairman of the Commission.
- (2) Of the persons first appointed to the Commission, three shall be appointed for terms of five years; three, for four years; three, for three years; and two, for two years. As these initial appointments expire all appointments shall be for terms of five years. A member whose term is expiring may be reappointed to another term. Vacancies shall be filled from time to time for the remainder of the term left vacant.
- (3) The members of the Commission shall be chosen from residents of Maryland and shall be broadly representative of the State
