In accordance with Section 17 of Article II of the Maryland Constitution, I have vetoed today House Bill 962 and am returning it to you.

This bill would authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to create a debt in the amount of one million, two hundred thousand dollars. The measure is a duplicate of Senate Bill 457 which has been signed and is now Chapter 572 of the 1968 Laws of Maryland.
