Senate Bill No. 4—By the President:

An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 4, 5, 6 and 7 of, and to add new Section 12A to, Chapter 403 of the Laws of Maryland of 1969, which Act authorized the creation of a State debt to be known as the "Outdoor Recreation Land Loan of 1969," correcting erroneous wording therein, clarifying certain provisions of the Act, including the imposition of the State property tax as the secondary source of funds for debt service as to both the principal of and interest on such State debt in the event revenues from the "State Property Transfer Tax" are in any
