municipal corporations to enact their own provisions for absentee voters in county-wide or state-wide elections. For this reason, I have declined to sign House Bill 859.

This bill amends a section of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act so as to increase the time limit for filing of claims.

The identical amendment to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act was accomplished by Senate Bill 395, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 5, 1970. Consequently, it is unnecessary for me to sign House Bill 955.
