

Section 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Gaithersburg that the date of the introduction of this Resolution is the 9th day of June, 1969, and shall become effective forty-five (45) days following its adoption, unless a prompt petition for referendum thereon shall be filed as permitted by law, and provided further that the notice as required by law shall be published in the Gaithersburg Gazette, being a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Gaithersburg, once each week in the weeks of June 9, 1969, June 16, 1969, June 23, 1969 and June 30, 1969. Said notice to provide for a public hearing to be held on July 21, 1969 at 8 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Mayor and City Council, 31 South Summit Avenue, Gaithersburg, Maryland.

Section 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of Gaithersburg, that as soon as this Resolution is adopted it shall become effective either as herein provided, or the following of a referendum, the City Administrator shall promptly send copies of said resolution to the following:
