738. BOUNDARIES.

The limits of the City of Westminster, as surveyed in 1896 are as follows: Beginning on the southwest at a stone marked "B.E.G.," planted on the bank of the Baltimore and Reisterstown turnpike on the line formerly a boundary between Baltimore and Frederick Counties, and run-
