This Indenture Tripartite made this Sixteenth Day of Aprile  
A.D. 1725 between Robert  
Godborough Senior of Saltsbury County Gent of the first part Robert  
Godborough of the same place Junior of the second part and Charles Ham-  
mond of Cumberland County of the third part whereas the said Robert  
Godborough Senior is married with Elizabeth the Daughter of Colonel  
Nicholas Greenbury and Sister to Colonel Charles Greenbury both deceased  
by which said Elizabeth the said Robert the Elder has given Robert the You-  
nger the party to these presents and whereas by the Death of the said Eliza-  
beth the said Robert the Elder becomes Tenant by the Courtesy of England of  
all the Lands and Estates of Inheritance whereof the said Elizabeth was  
Seised the first simple sole and several to the said Robert the Younger the  
Widow's Son and heir at Law of the said Elizabeth Now this Indenture  
witnesseth that the said Robert the Elder and Robert the Younger for and in  
Consideration of the Sum of two hundred Pounds Sterling to them in hand  
Paid or Secured to be paid the Receipt whereof they do hereby Acknowledge  
Have and each of them hath given granted bargained sold Alien'd Released  
and Confirmed and Do give Grant of them both by these presents for  
themselves and their heirs give grant bargain sold Alien Released and  
Confirm unto him the said Charles Hammond his heirs and Assigns for  
Ever All these several Tracts or parcels of Land hereafter mentioned  
viz. Town Neck Altogether and Middleborough lying in Cumberland  
County and Commonly called Greenburys Point and also All Surplussages  
Herownto belonging and to be taken thereunto accord by the said Robert  
the Elder and the said Elizabeth or by either of them to the Quantity thereof
