Sufficient Record Books Necessary for the Entering up of all Matters and things
relating to the Chancery Provincial and Land Offices And shall Diligently Care-
fully look after preserve and Maintain All the Several Books of Records now
being and remaining in the Said Offices in good Repair Contained in particular lists
herunto Annexed Signed by the Commissioners Appointed by Act of Assembly to repair
the Records in the Secretaries Comissarys Office & As also those that from time to time
shall be repaired by the Directions of the Said Comissioners And Added thereto in such
Manner as that when he shall be Dismissed from Officiating longer in the Said Offices
shall Deliver All the aforesaid Records to the Next Person that Succeeds in the Said
Offices in good Repair and Order According to the true Intent and Meaning of the
Acts of Assembly in that Case made and Provided that then the Above Written Obligation
to be Void and of no Effect Otherwise to remain in full force and Vertue in Law
